The Under 12 team participated in a non-competitive league based format in 2019 commencing in the first week of April and running through to September. We played 12 league games and with the exception of one game we were competitive against all teams faced and only lost out on 4 occasions with 2 of these losses being by 1 point. We were also invited to participate in the Jim McHugh Memorial Tournament in Garrycastle and qualified for the Plate Final on October 13th however on the evening we had to give way to a better Lilliput Gaels team.

Our year can be seen as a relatively successful year with the lads getting football for 7 months of the year with a training session each week. The non-competitive nature of the Under 12 division enabled us to field 13-a-side teams on some evenings which was a help as our numbers at 11/12 year olds was maximum 16. To this end we would like to thank those lads from U 10 that came on evenings when we were short of players and helped us out to make up a team and we would feel that this benefitted these lads to be playing at a higher grade.

We also participated in an Under 11 competition towards the end of the year with games against Tubberclare, a 3 game blitz in Moate and a game against St Josephs. This competition did not commence until September so unfortunately the timing didn't lend to any longevity, but we do feel that it was worthwhile to participate and an enjoyable one for the 10/11 year olds.

Going forward there will be issues with this age group with regard to numbers as there were only 16 11/12 year olds and supplementing with 10 year olds was a necessity. With this group now most likely moving to play in competitive football it will be essential to have all those coming out of U10 in 2020 playing with this group to ensure we will be in a position to field 15-a-side teams.

We would like to thank the club executive for their support this year with gear and Supermacs after the Garrycastle final. Finally a special word of thanks to the parents for their support in

bringing the lads to training and all matches this year and looking forward to their continued support for 2020.

The above table illustrates the players registered to play in 2019. Through consultation with Ardnagrath, Drumraney and Tang National Schools, players in the area who are not playing have been identified.

The least amounts are from years 2005, 2006 and 2007 which would be u-14/u-15 teams for the coming year. Having consulted with county board representatives in October, the club (along with Tang) have requested the reintroduction of the premier competition, the 13-aside and 11-aside competitions in 2019 to facilitate teams with small numbers. At the time of writing, we were still awaiting the outcome of this request, and whether grades will be odd years or even years, all of which were to be discussed at a planning meeting on Wednesday last.

6.Children's Officers Report
