There was discussion in relation to Maryland Tang numbers at each of the age grades. There was a discussion that based on the numbers at U15 age grade and that in order for Maryland Tang to field in this age grade U13 players would be required to be played. It was agreed that the incoming committee would contact the parents of U13 players to check if parents are happy for their children to play at U15 level.

There was an action taken for the chairmen of both Maryland and Tang adult clubs to look to approaching Maryland and Tang players to potentially take on a coaching role at U15 level.

There was an action taken to contact the parents of the U17 players in relation to potentially forming an independent team.

Western Gaels

A meeting was held with representatives from Maryland, Tang, Maryland Tang and Garrycastle on the 17th April 2021 via Microsoft teams to discuss proposals for the U17's for the 2021 season. The proposal to form an independent team with Garrycastle, called Western Gaels, at U17 age grade was agreed. The formation of Western Gaels for the second consecutive year, at the U17 age grade ensured that players at these age grades were being given the opportunity to play football at their age grades. The formation of Western Gaels was a great success with the U17's reaching the Division 2 Shield semi-final and I would like





to say thank you to everyone who helped in the formation and success of Western Gaels again this year.

Maryland Tang Chairman

The committee would like to thank Tom Keenan for his contribution to Maryland Tang as chairman for the last number of years. Tom stepped down from the position of Maryland Tang chairperson earlier this year. Maryland Tang vice chairman Trevor Farrell put his name forward for the chairman position. David Coughlan, Tang GAA, put his name forward for the vice chairman role. David Coughlan and Trevor Farrell were ratified as Vice Chairman and Chairman respectively at a Maryland Tang committee meeting held on the 07 Jul 2021.

3 Coaches Reports

U-17

With Western Gaels having come into existence in 2020, we approached Garrycastle about a similar

agreement in 2021, for both u-15 and u-17. Garrycastle did not wish to amalgamate at u-15 as they

felt they were strong enough to operate on their own. After some negotiations and reflection, they

decided to proceed with Western Gaels at u-17. The mentors were Niall Ward, Michael Fagan (both

Garrycastle), Ronan Farrell and Tom Keenan (Maryland/Tang).

The team commenced training in May and played 3 challenge games against St. Dominics, Tubberclair and Ballymahon. Placed in the division 2 championship, the team suffered a heavy defeat to eventual finalists Caulry, drew with Millmore Gaels and lost narrowly to St. Josephs in the

group stages. A quarter final with a strong Mullingar Shamrocks was next up, whereby the team gave a good account of themselves, pushing the eventual Championship winners for 50 minutes before fading at the end of the game. A shield semi-final away to The Downs followed a similar trajectory, where missed goal chances proved costly as the home team won out. In terms of players, there was one player who did not play with Western Gaels, due to other sporting commitments. At the time of writing, Maryland/Tang have planned to talk to the parents of the players, and also to Garrycastle, to see what approach to take with our u-17s for 2022.

U-15

Working off a small panel, the u-15s had a relatively successful year. The mentors were Darragh





McCormack, Eoin Farrell, Ronan Farrell and William Reynolds, with James Taplin, John Seery, Donal

Hogan and Keith Malynn also helping out at times. The team commenced training in May and were

placed in the division 3 championship.

The group stage of the championship opened with two home wins over Inny Shamrocks and St.

Josephs. This was followed by an away defeat to Tyrellspass, before being rounded up with another

home win over Caulry's second team. Finishing second in the group, the team were drawn to play St.Michaels in the quarter final in Drumraney. In a ding-dong game, St. Michaels won out with late

goals putting a flattering slant on the final gap. This left Maryland/Tang in a shield semi final away to Tyrellspass. In a courageous display, Maryland/Tang were ahead at half time but ran out of steam in the second half, losing by 10 points in the end.

A big thank you to the parents of this group, as with the small numbers, having players available for every game was crucial. With the strong overlap of players with the u-13s, co-ordination between the mentors of both teams was crucial.

Cul Camp

Held in August in Drumraney, there were 120 boys and girls in attendance. Similar to 2020, the camp was a sell out with maximum numbers attending. While not all were from Maryland/Tang, this was a success and the club should look to continue the camp next Summer.

Player Pathway

A club player pathway was an action point for the Coaching Officers (Maryland & Tang) last year and the club released a player pathway to all coaches in January. This pathway outlines the different aspects that each age group should be following, with the aim of giving every





player the opportunity to improve as a footballer, regardless of the team's overall ability. The next step to this pathway is to make it measurable in some way.

Further Action Points

- Develop a coaching plan for the club, for example how we can upskill coaches. This
 would also involve getting current adult players involved in coaching once off with
 teams.
- 2. Establish stronger links with the Primary Schools, such as having coaches going in to lend a hand occasionally.
- 3. Change of mindset on definition of success in Maryland/Tang. Move away from judging success on trophies won to a more developmental attitude (e.g. progression of players through grades, skills obtained).
- 4. Act on getting qualified coaches who have gone through the grades involved in coaching again.
- 5. Look at setting schedules for age groups so a flyer/webpage can be produced to promote underage club.
- 6. Look at use of online cloud for developing coaching resources & also files.

5 Children's Officers Report

Throughout 2021, Maryland Tang continued to ensure all underage coaches were compliant to the requirements of the Children's First Act, in relation to Garda Vetting, attendance at Child Protection courses and coaching courses.

Thank you to everyone who took the time to complete the Garda Vetting Process, complete the child Safeguarding Temporary and Refresher Training and Foundation Level Coaching courses.

Maryland Tang were also required to submit a Child Safeguarding Risk Assessment this year which was submitted on 13th Jul 2021.
